In fact, starting in a new chat in this case is probably the best option to keep everything stable.

So here we are at the episode:

Luca accompanies his grandfather to the classic car auction
his grandfather finds the car of his youth

In my opinion, the narrative structure is very good because:

it has an emotional component (nostalgia for his grandfather)
it creates tension ("will he buy it?")
it shows the real usefulness of the app
it avoids the classic, overly hyped ending
it makes Luca competent without seeming arrogant

The only thing I would slightly improve is why Luca inspects so thoroughly, so that the discovery of the rust seems more natural and professional.

For example:

Luca notices small suspicious signs:
paint differences
damp smell
carpet that's too new
fresh deadening under the car
then he decides to investigate further
and finds the hidden damage

This makes the scene more believable and increases the narrative tension.

The episode could have this progression:

Arrival at the auction
Grandpa's excitement
Seemingly perfect car
High but "justified" price
Luca notices strange details
Thorough inspection
Discovery of hidden rust
Explanation of the enormous restoration costs
Grandpa gives up
End:
"Sometimes the real deal... is the one you avoid."

I think this could become one of the best episodes of the series.

Scene 1 — The Phone Call
